BACKGROUND LEVEL: Child/Elder

JOB PURPOSE: Assesses and treats a wide array of behavioral health conditions including cooccurring mental health and substance abuse issues; provides evaluation, diagnostic, counseling therapy, and crisis intervention to individuals, couples, families, groups in a clinical setting.

This position description may not include all of the listed duties, nor do all of the listed examples include all tasks which may be found or assigned to this position.

JOB DUTIES:

- Conducts intake assessments as assigned, orients clients to program rules and procedures, utilizes screening tools, and ensures necessary documents are signed.
- Assesses client's strengths and needs for the development of a treatment plan.
- Refers clients to other support services as needed including, but not limited to: medical evaluation and treatment, social services, specialty mental health treatment, or community health workers.
- Provides individual counseling to adolescents and adults utilizing evidence-based modalities.
- Facilitates evidence-based groups.

- Provides crisis intervention and warm hand offs for clients in other departments at IHC when needed.
- Charts all notes, assessments, treatment plans, discharge summaries, and client communication in a timely and professional manner.
- Prepares written summaries of a client's progress and recommendations to tribal courts when required.
- Collaborates with other service providers when needed to determine and fulfill unmet needs of clients and families.
- Educates, consults, and leads in-service training to appropriate professionals regarding clinical and administration matters.
- Provides education to the community on substance abuse, mental health, and prevention issues.
- Attends clinical staff meetings and discusses complex or high-risk clients with their supervisor.
- Maintains standards and practice in accordance with applicable laws, regulations and requirements, including confidentiality and professional standards.
- Prepares reports on caseload and submits to clinical supervisor as needed.
- Enhances professional growth and development.
- Performs other duties as assigned.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS/REQUIREMENTS:

- Master's Degree in Social Work, Counseling, or Psychology
- Three years of work experience in mental health, social work or psychology or equivalent combination of education and experience.
- State of New Mexico Licensed Professional Clinical Counselor (LPCC), Licensed Mental Health Counselor (LMHC), Licensed Clinical Social Worker (LCSW), or Licensed Master Social Worker (LMSW)
- CPR Certification.
- Must be able to pass a TB screening.
- Must provide written copy of immunization record prior to employment
- Valid New Mexico driver's license with ability to meet Pueblo of Isleta liability insurance requirements and maintain eligibility for insurance.
- Must be able to pass background check.
- Must be able to comply with the Pueblo of Isleta Drug Free Workplace policies.

KNOWLEDGE, SKILL AND ABILITY REQUIREMENTS:

- Knowledge of applicable federal, state, county and local laws, regulations, and requirements.
- Knowledge of the theory, principles and practices of clinical, developmental and counseling psychology.
- Knowledge of the theory, principles, practices, and treatment of alcohol and drug abuse.

- Knowledge of patient outreach services and activities, funding agencies, and community health care and vocational services.
- Knowledge and understanding of the Isleta Pueblo culture, tradition and values.
- Skill in operating various word-processing, spreadsheets, and database software programs.
- Ability to plan, implement, and evaluate individual patient care programs.
- Ability to maintain confidentiality.
- Ability to work independently and meet strict time lines.
- Ability to communicate efficiently and effectively both verbally and in writing.
- Ability to establish and maintain good working relationships with the individuals of varying social and cultural backgrounds.

PHYSICAL DEMANDS:

- Talk, hear sit, stand; use hands to handle objects, equipment, controls and reach with arms and hands.
- Position requires frequent lifting of 25 lbs.

WORK ENVIRONMENT:

- Work is performed in a typical interior/office environment.
- Exposure to individuals with behavioral problems and potentially harmful situations that may require crisis management and other techniques to protect self and client.
- Noise level is usually moderate.

Tribal and Native American Indian preference shall apply to all positions at Pueblo of Isleta.
